Can you feel some seasonal changes? Hope you are enjoying some time outside.

Last week students commemorated ANZAC Day with some learning, preparation and tasting of ANZAC slice. This treat that can be enjoyed in lunch boxes any time of the year; recipe below.

This week students are in the garden, tending to some much-needed weeding, mulching, watering with worm tea and all-round maintenance. The weather makes for a productive time in the garden where students enjoy getting hands on and physical. We work hard together and celebrate how good it feels to take care of and enjoy our garden, flora and fauna. Every other week we endeavour to celebrate our garden when we harvest and use our produce in kitchen classes.

Jingili Primary School was successful in their application to Landcare NT and Native Plants NT for some expert education on flora and fauna. This week we had our fauna specialists come in to speak of the importance of biodiversity of both flora and fauna. Upper Primary students will have the opportunity to explore our garden more closely and extend their learning.

ANZAC SLICE

INGREDIENTS

11/4 cups plain flour

3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar

150g butter, chopped

1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

1 1/4 cups rolled oats

1 cup shredded coconut

2 tablespoons golden syrup

2 tablespoons boiling water

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Grease and line a 3cm-deep, 19cm x 29cm (base) slice pan with baking paper, allowing a 2cm overhang at long ends.

Combine flour, oats, sugar and coconut in a large bowl. Make a well in the centre.

Place butter and syrup in a saucepan over low heat. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 8 to 10 minutes or until smooth.

Combine bicarbonate of soda and boiling water in a jug. Remove butter mixture from heat. Stir in bicarbonate of soda mixture. Add to flour mixture. Stir to combine.

Transfer to prepared pan. Using the back of a spoon, press mixture evenly into pan.

Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until golden. Cool in pan. Cut into squares. Serve.




IDEAS IN NUTRITION



Healthy Eating and Mood: Fuelling Your Child's Happiness
