

#### Pizza Dough

- 1 tbs yeast
- 1 cup water
- 315g of plain flour
- 2 tbs olive oil
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tsp sugar

Mix together and kneed for 10 mins, let rise for 30 min.

#### **Basil Pesto**

45g (1/4 cup) pine nuts 1 1/2 cups fresh basil leaves 2 small garlic cloves, halved 60g (3/4 cup) shredded parmesan 5 tbsp olive oil

#### Method

Preheat oven to 180°C. Spread the 45g (1/4 cup) pine nuts over a baking tray. Bake in oven for 5 minutes or until toasted. Remove from oven and set aside for 10 minutes to cool.

Place the pine nuts, basil leaves, garlic, parmesan in the bowl of a food processor and process until finely chopped. With the motor running, gradually add the 5 tbsp olive oil in a thin steady stream until well combined.
